



YMCA Housing Fact Sheet



DESCRIPTION:

For more than 75 years, the YMCA has provided Single Room Occupancy (SRO) housing, hotel and senior apartments in Chicago and Chicagoland. The 1,309 SRO rooms in the city serve low-income single adults. Rental subsidies are available. In addition, the YMCA provides 401 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) senior apartments. The YMCA offers supportive services such as medical treatment, psychiatric care, case management, food and clothing assistance, often in collaboration with other community providers. The YMCA also operates a Supportive Housing Project (SHP), which provides residence to homeless youth.
